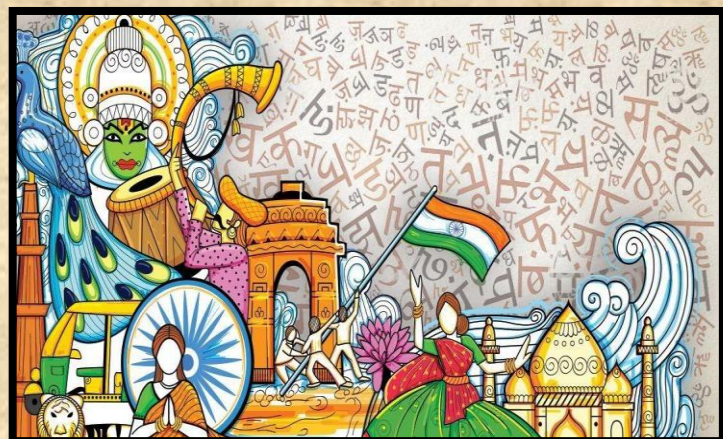


All the Jindal schools celebrated and rejoiced the culture and heritage and set a universal vision for the budding leaders.

Audiobook Project – The Voice of Vijayanagar IVMites

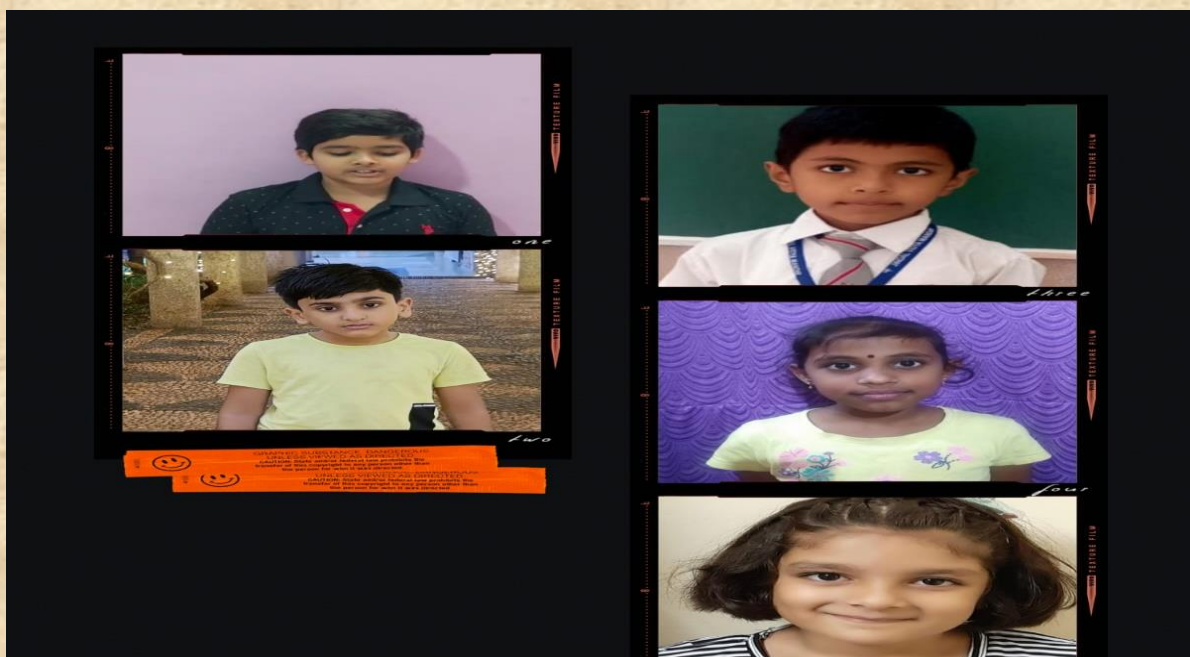
The audiobook project for the month of November 2022 started from November 11th and completed by 29th.

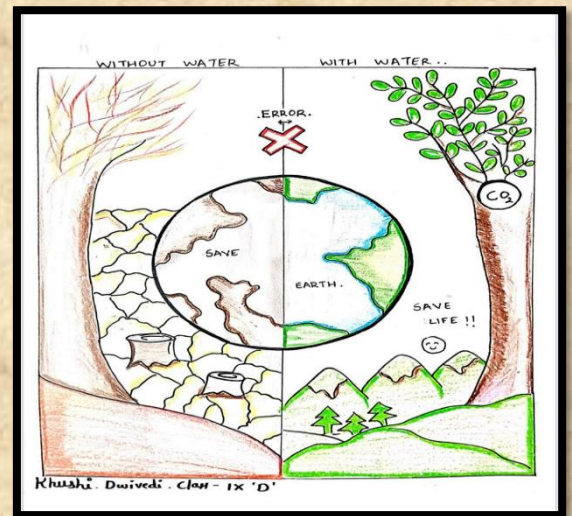
