Expectation from the students

- 1. They should take care of their health & be robust & strong.
- 2. They should always be friendly with others in and outside the school.
- 3. They should not be vulgar in their talk & behavior.
- 4. They should accept whatever work is assigned to them as their rightful share. They should face difficulties courageously.
- 5. They should always be ready to lead a helping hand at home to their parents, brothers and sisters and in school to teachers, companions, and any unattended visitors, they happen to meet in the school premises.
- 6. They should never cheat or be unfair at play.
- 7. They should always speak truth.
- 8. They should never be cruel. They must know that cruelty is the trait of a bully while kindness is the work of a gentleman.
- 9. They should respect the beauty of the classroom and of the school premises and report, any damage they may observe.
- 10. They should never hesitate to say 'no' when asked or tempted to do a thing which they know to be wrong.
- 11. They should respect the liberty and rights of others.
- 12. Instead of laminating and grumbling over the evils of the world, they should try to contribute their share to make it a batter place to live in.
- 13. They should look upon of people from all parts of the world as their brethren, irrespective of their colour and creed.
- 14. They should not waste their time in idle gossip.

Recommendations to Parents/Guardians

- 1. Ensure your wards' regularity, punctuality and decent behaviour.
- 2. Kindly see that your ward's textbooks and exercise books are labelled and carried according to the timetable for the day. Extra books should be avoided to reduce the weight of the bag.
- 3. As the medium of instruction of the school is English, students should be motivated to converse in English at home also. Please encourage your ward to watch only useful programmes on TV.
- 4. You are advised to maintain regular contact with the school. We earnestly recommend that parents and guardians should go through their wards' almanac daily and countersign at the specified areas.
- 5. If your child is suffering from any infectious disease you are requested to send your ward to school only after he/she is completely cured.
- 6. It is always advisable to communicate with the school about the problems of your ward for seeking guidance. Please address your letters to the Principal after a discussion with Section In charge.
- 7. Please ensure to inform the school of any change in your address, designation, contact number, e-mail id etc. in the prescribed proforma.
- 8. The students must be responsible for their own belongings. The school is not responsible in any manner for the same. Making all belongings with name, class etc. is mandatory.
- 9. Hazardous and costly items are banned in the school.
- 10. Parents are requested to acknowledge all the academic reports of their ward promptly, be it in the Report card, answer script, assessment sheet or anything of similar nature.
- 11.Please avoid criticizing the school of teacher in the presence of your child. You are welcome to put forth your suggestions and complaints at the school reception or via e-mail.
- 12. No teacher is allowed to tutor his/her own students. Please do not request or pay the teachers for the same.
- 13. Parents are requested to see off and receive their wards personally at the bus stop, along with their parent card especially KG V. Please do not enter the school busses for any reason.
- 14.Please do not get into an argument with the teachers, student(s), conductors or drivers in the buses. In case of any problem, please contact the school office/transport in charge.
- 15. The school has an equipped sick bay with a trained nurse round the clock. A registered doctor pays regular visit too. First Aid is provided by the school followed by a contact with the parents or further recourse.
- 16. You can meet the Principal or Section In charges during the PTMs or with prior appointment through the reception.

Best Methods of Learning

- Read the content to be taught in advance i.e. pre-reading
- Read the content taught on the same day at home i.e. post-reading
- Mark difficult portions in different inks in the class notebook
- Discuss the difficulties in the class, the very next day, when they are fresh in the memory.
- Complete H W, assignments and submit on time.
- Prepare date-wise schedule for the revisions and ensure two revisions before every exam.
- Write the content in points after learning i.e. revise by writing.
- Discuss individual difficulties with the teachers and other experts separately in detail as no two individuals are alike.
- Seek advice and guidelines of the teachers, Headmistress and Counsellor whenever needed.

General Guidelines to Parents / Guardians

The school believes in firmness. Disobedience and disregard to rules will be looked at seriously. In light of common sense or of good manners, any work or action likely to lower the image of the school is regarded as a breach of school discipline. The school reserves the right to expel students whose diligence or the progress in studies is considered unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students. Immorality, insubordination or contempt of authority and breaking bounds are always sufficient reasons for immediate expulsion or rustication.

- 1. Parents are required not to enter the class room to see their child or teacher during class hours without the permission of the Principal. Kindly stick to visiting hours as announced from time to time.
- 2. They are required to inform the school if there is any change to their address / telephone number etc.
- 3. Leave for half day should not be asked for security reasons. In emergency written permission must be taken from the Principal and the class teacher should be informed.
- 4. All leave applications should be sent in advance before proceeding on leave. Application should be addressed to the Principal through the class teacher.
- 5. Children, when sick, should not be sent to school to attend tests / classes.
- 6. Parent's attention is drawn to the fact that criticism of the teacher or school in the presence of the students should be scrupulously avoided because it causes the students lose respect for their teachers and will retard their progress.

- 7. Should there be any legitimate complaint, please see the Principal at once or write a separate letter addressed to him/her. He/She will look into this matter personally.
- 8. Any communication made by the parents / guardians should be addressed to the Principal through the class teacher.
- 9. Parents are requested to pay fees (if not deducted from salary) regularly on or before given dates to avoid penalty.
- 10. The name, admission no., class, section and house of the pupil should be clearly marked on the belongings of the students e.g., ties, jerseys, skirts, pants and shirts, water bottle, tiffin box etc.
- 11. Parents are required to co-operate with the school in its attempt to help their wards' progress by paying attention towards their regularity, punctuality & discipline and by taking interest in their work. They should check the diary every day and note the home work and other instructions given. In case of small children, they are advised to check the bags of their wards to see if any notice / invitation etc. has been issued.
- 12. Care must be taken of all school property. If any damage is done, it will be made good by the concerned student together with a fine imposed for offence.
- 13 Parents are advised not to send money to school for any purpose.
- 14. It is not advisable to bring valuable articles like expensive watches, fountain pens, transistor, calculators and jewellery to the school. In case of any loss of valuable or other articles the authorities will try their best to trace it but shall not undertake any responsibility for the same. Bringing mobile phone to school is strictly prohibited.

 15. All students are expected to join the school on the noticed dates at the beginning of the term. A fine of Rs.

 10/- per day of absence is imposed unless the Principal is informed before the end of assembly, on the last working day. Parents and guardian will appreciate that absence during the term is not in the best interest of the student. They are asked not to apply for leave if it can be avoided.
- 16. The wards of those parents, who avoid meeting the school authorities when advised to do so, may not be allowed to attend the classes.
- 17. Parents should refer the school calendar, date sheets and other circulars before making enquiries.
- 18. It is compulsory for the student to complete 80% attendance in the academic session to make him / her eligible to take final assessment and hence promotion.

SCHOOL RULES

- 1. The almanac and ID card should be carried by the students to school every day. In case the students lose their almanac, a replacement will be made on the payment of Rs. 250/-
- 2.1 Parents urged to inculcate the punctuality in their ward(s). They must be sent to school on time (refer page no. 140). If late they will be allowed to attend classes but marked absent on roll (remark will be written in the almanac).
- 2.2 It is advised and suggested to all parents that whatever the private mode of transport in which they wish to send their ward(s) to school, it must be ensured that it is not over crowded and the children are comfortably seated.
- 2.3The bell before the assembly is a signal for the students to go for the assembly. As soon as they are back in their classes, the students get their books ready for the first period. They should maintain perfect discipline.
- 2.4 Change of classrooms between periods should be done in silence/smooth and in an orderly manner.
- 2.5 Students should be habitually clean and always neatly dressed. The school uniform should be worn on all the working days and for all school functions. Students who are not in proper uniform will not be allowed to enter their classrooms.
- 2.6 Only English should be spoken in the school premises. Noncompliance will be reflected in the Assessment.
- 2.7 Shouting or whistling is not allowed in or around the school building.
- 2.8 Throwing of anything at anyone is forbidden.
- 2.9 Other than text books or library books, no books, magazines should be brought to school without the Principal's permission. Bringing objectionable literature to the school may lead to severe disciplinary action.
- 3. Lending or borrowing money or any article is not permitted.
- 3.1 The school is not responsible for article lost. It is not advised to bring valuable articles like expensive watches, pens, calculators, cameras, cell phones, i-pods and jewellery etc. in school.
- 3.2 Care must be taken of all school property and no one should scratch or spoil the desks or chairs or damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the wall or in any way damage things belonging to others.
 - a. Damage done even by accident should be reported at once to the class teacher, class monitor/reps or to the principal.
 - b. A student is put under reformatory measures if he/she damages the school property. However, if he/she persists a fine is imposed.
 - c. Anyone who notices something damaged should report even if he or she does not know who has done
 - it. Students are not allowed to bring any sharp instruments to school.
- 3.3 Bicycles must be locked. Students must not ride around on the school compound on bicycles.
- 3.4 Students who come to school under the care of guardian/attendant/rickshaw-driver should never leave before he/she arrives to take them back. In case of delay, they should report to the school office.
- 3.5 Students are required to go straight back home after school. If found otherwise they are liable to be punished.
- 3.6 Students are warned not to buy anything from the street vendors.
- 3.7 Students should be polite wherever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged by their

conduct. They should greet their teachers when they meet them. Bullying and use of foul language are punishable offences.

- 3.8 The school reserves for itself the right to terminate any student whose progress in studies is unsatisfactory or whose conduct is a bad example for others.
- 4. The name, class, section of the student should be clearly marked on his/her belongings.
- 4.1 School appointees should wear their respective badges daily.
- 4.2 Security of our students is a matter of great concern to us; hence students coming on self-driven automobiles or two wheelers are not allowed.
- 4.3 Students must come to school in uniform only. This rule applies even when they come to school for any purpose other than attending classes or even after school hours.
- 4.4 Students who borrow uniform, from the school must return it after cleaning it on the next working day. If the borrowed uniform is not returned on the due date a fine @ Rs. 10/- per day will be charged. If a student takes crepe bandage, a new crepe bandage was to be given to the infirmary.
- 4.5 Parents are urged to monitor the use of internet especially the social networking sites, if at all used by their ward(s).
- 4.6 Bringing cameras, cell phones, electronic audio and video items, i-pods, fireworks etc.; bursting crackers, splashing water or color in the school premises is strictly forbidden even during festival times. Non-Compliance of these instructions can result in expulsion from the school.
- 5. The school reserves the right to take strict disciplinary action against a student if he / she:
 - a. Violates the school rules.
 - b. Indulges in any form of indiscipline or anti-social activity in and outside the school.
 - c. Bring undesirable material or any sharp instrument or weapon to the school.
 - d. Often arrives late to the school.
 - e. Does not stick to the prescribed uniform.
 - f. Misbehaves with teachers or students.
 - g. Mishandles, disfigures or damages any school property.
 - h. Acts / works in a manner that are likely to lower the image of the school.
- 6. The school is not responsible for any loss of article by the students.
- 7. Parents or guardians are requested not to visit their wards or teachers in the classrooms. The Parents Teacher Meeting is held every month as per schedule notified separately.

ADMISSION PROTOCOLS

Photocopy of birth certificate from the concerned authorities is to be submitted at the time of admission. The date of birth once entered in the school records will not be changed under any circumstances what so ever.
- C) Class I to IX & XI: Admission is given to children with a background of English medium education after admission test, interaction round with the teachers and produce of original Transfer Certificate from their previous school.

Note: all new entrants must submit two copies of the most recent stamp size colour photograph of the child at the time of admission.

ABSENCE:

- 1. Students are responsible for making up all work missed during the period of their absence.
- 2. No student will be allowed to leave the school campus during the school hours. However, in case of any emergency, the parent(s)/ guardian should come to the school with the parent's card and an application, explaining the reason to take the ward(s). If the Principal/Headmistress is satisfied with the explanation, the ward(s) may be allowed to go after filling the proforma concerned in duplicate.
- 3. No student who was absent on the previous day will be admitted to the class without the diary note from the parent/guardian in the regularity record of the almanac.
- 4. Absence without granted leave or unexplained absence for six consecutive working days will lead to strict disciplinary action as deemed fit.
- 5. Those absent without sanctioned leave will be fined at the rate of Rs. 5/- per day.
- 6. Absence for more than three days immediately after a vacation renders the students liable to have his/her name stuck off the rolls, if prior permission has not been availed.
- 7. It is compulsory for the students to complete 85% of their attendance in the year to make them eligible to make Final Assessment.
- 8. Absence without proper information over the period of a week and continuous absence for 90 days or more with or without information renders a pupil liable to have his/her name struck off the roll, the admission fee must be paid again for re-admission.

Leave:

- 1) No leave of absence is granted except on prior written application from parents or guarding's and even then for a plausible reason only.
- 2) Every leave (due to sickness or otherwise) must be entered briefly in student Absence Record pages at the end of Almanac and signed by the parent.
- 3) Leave may be granted to student only on the following grounds
 - a. In case of serious illness or death of a very near relative.
 - b. For the condolence visits if the student is the only male member of the family and his presence is essential according to the custom.
 - c. To attend the marriage of his/her own brother, sister or brother/sister of either parent.
 - d. To perform the tika ceremony of his sister if he is the eldest brother in the family.
- 4) Those absent because of sickness must present the medical prescription along with medical reports on diagnosis. If required, the school will get the medical tests conducted. (The leave will be sanctioned subject subject to confirmation of the tests) and it is

mandatory to submit the fitness certificate from the doctor on the day of rejoicing the school.

- 5) Every student must have at least 85% attendance to appear in any examination. Those who fail to fulfill criterion for any of the examinations, will be debarred from that examination and marked zero for the same in the mark sheet. Request from the defaulters in this regard will not be entertained. 85% attendance criterion is applicable to each of the two examinations separately Benefit of having more attendance for half yearly will not be given to the annual. The relaxation in the attendance may be granted subject to the full satisfaction of the Principal on any of the following two grounds:
 - Medical grounds: In case the child is seriously sick and remains absent for two or more than two consecutive working days he/she will have to produce the prescription and medical certificate from the competent authority.
 - Any mishappening in the family under both the above mentioned conditions it is the duty of the parents to inform the school well in time.
- 6) A student returning to school after suffering from any infectious/contagious disease should produce a doctor's certificate of fitness of to attend the classes. Students suffering from the following disease must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class.

a. Chicken pox : Till scabs fall completely

b. Cholera : Till the child completely well

c. Conjunctivitis : Till redness in the eyes completely disappears
d. Measles : Two weeks after the rashes disappear
e. Mumps : Until swelling has gone (about one month)

f. Whooping Cough : Six months

Note: A discharge slip along with the other related documents will be required from the hospital in case a student has been hospitalized for any disease (e.g. jaundice, typhoid, malaria etc.)

7) Leave application should always be addressed to the Principal through Class Teacher.

WITHDRAWAL:

- 1. Withdrawal from the school will be considered on the written request for the same by the parent or guardian of the child to the principal at a calendar months' notice. (Oral information shall not be entertained)
- 2. Fees for full semester inclusive of vacations has to be paid, whatever be the time of withdrawal during the academic year. School leaving Certificate will be issued after full &

final settlement of accounts/dues and clearance certificate form the concerned authorities.

- 3. Transfer or withdrawal certificate will not be issued until all dues of the school are settled.
- 4. Students can be asked to leave the school on the following grounds.
 - a. Disciplinary
 - b. Unsatisfactory progress in scholastic and co-scholastic areas.
 - c. Not prompted to next higher class for two years. As a rule, only those students will be retained on the role of the school who can take the school leaving examination under 18 years of age.
- 5. A child falling twice in the same class will not be permitted to continue his/her studies in the school especially if he/she becomes overage for that class.
- 6. A clear calendar months' notice in writing or a month's fee in lieu of notice must be given before the pupil can be withdrawn. Annual fees should be paid proportionately.
- 7. Those who leave school in May must, in all cases, pay the fee for the month of June.
- 8. Transfer certificate is not issued until all dues of the school are settled.
- 9. Students can be asked to leave the school on the following grounds.
 - a. Disciplinary
 - b. Unsatisfactory
 - c. Repeated detention in the class
- 10.A child who fails twice in the same class will not be permitted to continue his / her studies in the school, especially if he / she is over age.

Note: Where the withdrawal take place due to above reasons questions of the charging a month's fee in lieu of notice does not arise.
