
The Biennial ISW Science Conclave 2023 :

School Social Responsibility: Anti Nylon Manja Oath

Kite flying is a tradition during Makar Sankranti and other cultural festivals where kites, usually made from light weight paper and bamboo, are flown and people engage in competition to 'cut' down other kites. The strings often contain abrasives like glass powder, for easily cutting the string of the opponent's kite; the density of kites and strings becomes dangerous for birds — the skies become a death trap. The most common victims are pigeons and kites, which frequent in the heavily populated areas. Many other species, like parrots and endangered vultures, are also at risk. After identifying and realising the issue; the students of Jindal Vidya Mandir, Kalmeshwar have taken following oath.

'We will not use nylon manja (string) to fly kite; We know that use of Nylon thread is banned, We will not break the rule by purchasing or selling it. We are bound to inform nearest police station if someone is engaged in this type of activity. We will raise awareness about the harmful effects of nylon thread for kite flying. We consider this as our National duty.'

Principal Pallavi Chakkilala appreciated the initiative taken by the students.

International Award for Young People (IAYP) :

Awarness Session on Good and Bad Touch: Safety & Wellbeing..

Touch is nurturing, in other words, loving, kind and wanted by the child; touch plays a key role in a child's healthy development. Nurturing physical touch promotes development of young children's physiological systems involved in regulating emotions and stress responses. It is important for early Adolescents to identify the nurturing touch and a touch which makes them uncomfortable.

An awareness session for middle school students was conducted to educate them about the types of touch through a demonstration. Students of grade VI and VII shared their most trusted people in their lives with whom they could share their feelings. 




Republic Day Celebration : A National Feat..

To celebrate the occasion of India leading as G20 Presidency for the first time, the children should be educated about G20 and India's Presidency in this multilateral forum.

Students of grade IX presented assembly based on G20 literature provided by CBSE. To make the students aware of importance of G20 Presidency. Collectively, the G20 accounts for 85% of Global GDP, 75% of International Trade and Two-Thirds of the World population making it the premier forum for International Economic Cooperation. The theme of India's G20 Presidency -"Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" or "One Earth One Family One Future" - .

Special Educational Needs : Service and Servitude..

The Centre of Excellence at JVM Kalmeshwar facilitated the enrollment of teachers for the training/workshop on "Teaching Phonics to Children with Special Needs" conducted by Eblity, a Non Profit Organization.

Every alternate day, a video was shared with the teachers on origins of difficulties in reading and pillars of phonics teaching, so the facilitator can handhold the children struggling with reading and writing difficulties.

These videos could aid in awareness and skill development. The prominent takeaways:

1) Unique challenges faced by children with phonological difficulties.

2) Manifestation of reading and spelling challenges faced by children.

3) Strategies to support children with challenges in reading.

A total of 36 teachers enrolled for the above program.

Career guidance & Counselling :
