




Promoting Child Safety

Dr. Sushma further explained the hazards of using disposable sanitary napkins and discussed various available options that are safe for health. 




Oath taking on the occasion of 'Makar Sankranti'.

Kite flying during Makar Sankranti is years long tradition. The kites are usually made from lightweight paper and bamboo. People engage in competition to 'cut' down other kites, the strings often contain abrasives like glass powder for easily cutting the string of the opponent's kite; the density of kites and strings becomes dangerous for birds of varied species —the sky turns into a dead trap. After identifying and realizing the issue, the students of Jindal Vidya Mandir kalmeshwar have taken the following oath.' We will not use nylon manja strings to fly kites. We know that the use of Nylon thread is banned, we will not break the rule by purchasing or selling it. We are bound to inform the nearest police station if someone is engaged in this type of activity. We will raise awareness about the harmful effects of Nylon thread for kite flying. We consider this as a 'National duty'.




Career Counselling and Guidance.

Two days' career counseling and guidance sessions were organised in the Activity room, Jindal Vidya Mandir Kalmeshwar for class X State and CBSE. On the first day the session was conducted by Mr Sujit Bhadbhade, a career counsellor, motivational speaker and entrepreneur. At the outset he conducted an hour long MCQ based examination consisting of competency based questions in science, maths etc and then further guided students. On the second day Mr Sanket Gala , CA, Student mentor and faculty at CAPS, was the resource person of the session on "Career in Commerce". He guided students to think beyond saturating streams like Engineering and Medical. The main objective of conducting these sessions was to facilitate all-round development of the student and to help students in the proper choice of courses and career.

It also aimed to minimize the mismatching between education and employment.

In the last leg of the sessions, Students put forth their queries and sought guidance. They felt motivated and broadened their horizon in terms of career choices.

Himani Chauhan Jvm: Play based activities blended with science concepts results not just in fun filled classes but even better understanding of the concept. Believing the same, Grade 1 students were engaged in a lively balloon activity to teach them about presence of air all around us. The teacher began with demonstration on how releasing air makes balloons fly. Further, encouraged students to inflate balloons themselves to observe and feel the air released out of the balloons and understand the properties of air.





















OH! My Childhood Memories




