Recently, I had the enriching opportunity to represent Jindal Vidya Mandir, at a courtroom simulation event hosted by Delhi Public School, Lava. The experience was nothing short of extraordinary.

The classroom was transformed into a real courtroom setup, complete with a panel of 5 judges, 10 lawyers (5 each from the prosecution and defence), and 8 Members of Society (MOS) — creating an atmosphere that was both challenging and inspiring.

As a lawyer, I was assigned the high-profile Padmanabhaswamy Temple case, and my role demanded deep research, legal reasoning, and persuasive speaking. I studied constitutional articles, past judgments, and historical records to build a strong argument. Presenting my research before such a sharp panel of judges pushed me to think on my feet and stay composed skills that go far beyond textbooks.

But this event was more than just about presenting a case. It was about participation, teamwork, and learning from every moment. Whether you win or lose, what truly matters is how much you grow. I firmly believe that even if you forget your victory, never forget your loss, because loss is what sharpens your thinking, builds your resilience, and humbles your journey.

That said, I feel grateful and honoured to have been awarded "Best Speaker". It wasn't just recognition of my voice, but of the time, research, and passion I invested into the case.

This experience has taught me that every stage is a learning ground — and when you step into it with heart and hard work, it rewards you with lessons that stay for life. In the end, this courtroom experience was more than a competition — it was a lesson in courage, preparation, and the power of speaking up. I walked in as a student, and walked out with confidence, clarity, and a story worth remembering.
