Fun with the Sieve of Eratosthenes :A Fun Learning Experience !Our class 4 students had a blast creating the Sieve of Eratosthenes to explore Prime and Composite numbers. With colorful charts and enthusiastic participation, they discovered the magic of prime numbers and how they form the foundation of all other numbers. The students learned : - Prime Numbers: Numbers that have only two factors – 1 and themselves. Examples: 2, 3, 5, 7.....- Composite Numbers: Numbers that have more than two factors. Examples: 4, 6, 8, 9.....The Sieve in Action:Students systematically put the Composite numbers in triangles and each prime number in circles revealing the prime numbers hidden among the numbers 2 to 100. It was amazing to see the patterns emerge and the excitement on their faces as they discovered prime numbers. Conclusion:The Sieve of Eratosthenes activity was a huge success, making maths fun and interactive.

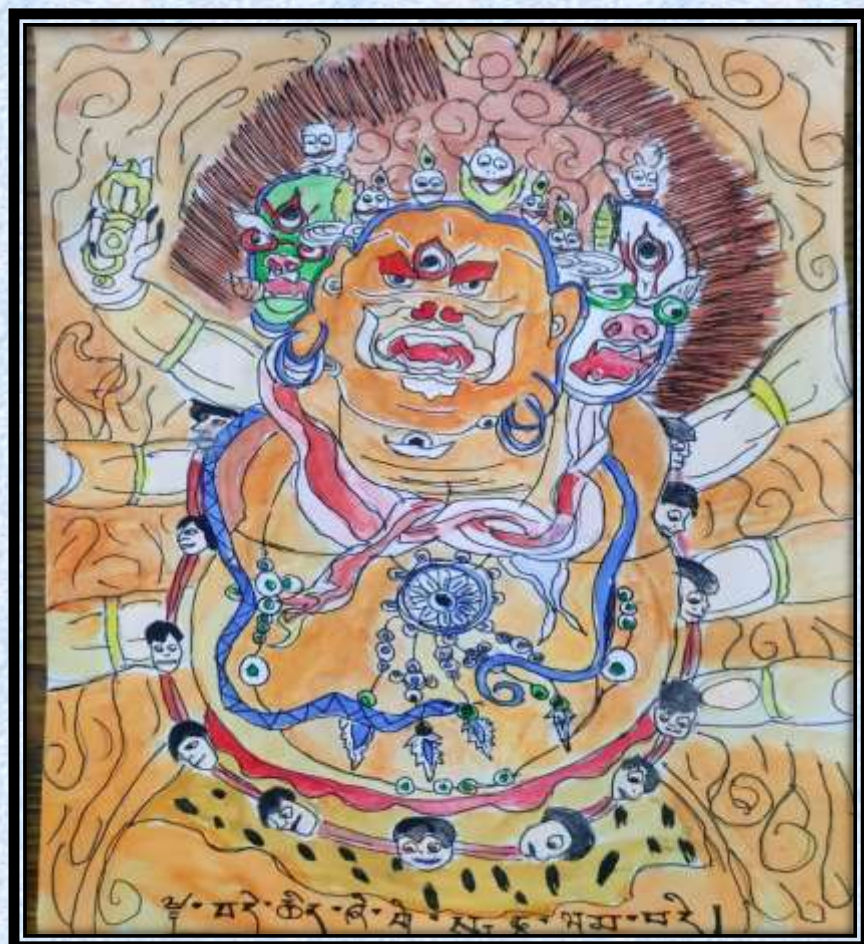
