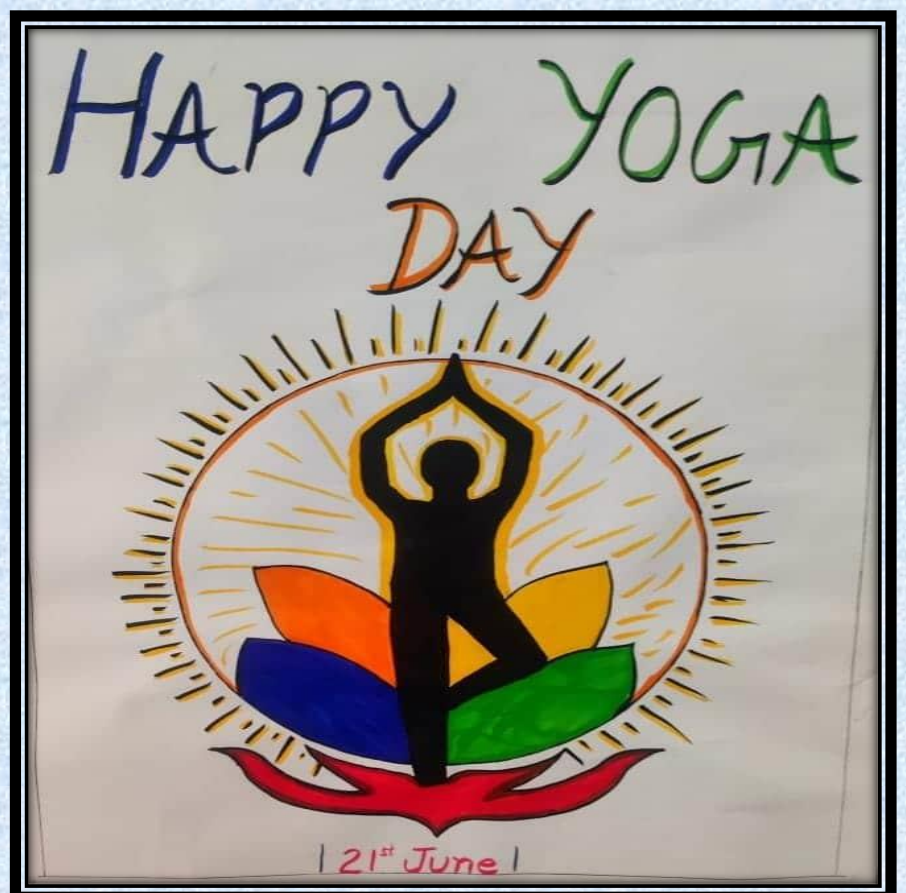
Singing competition

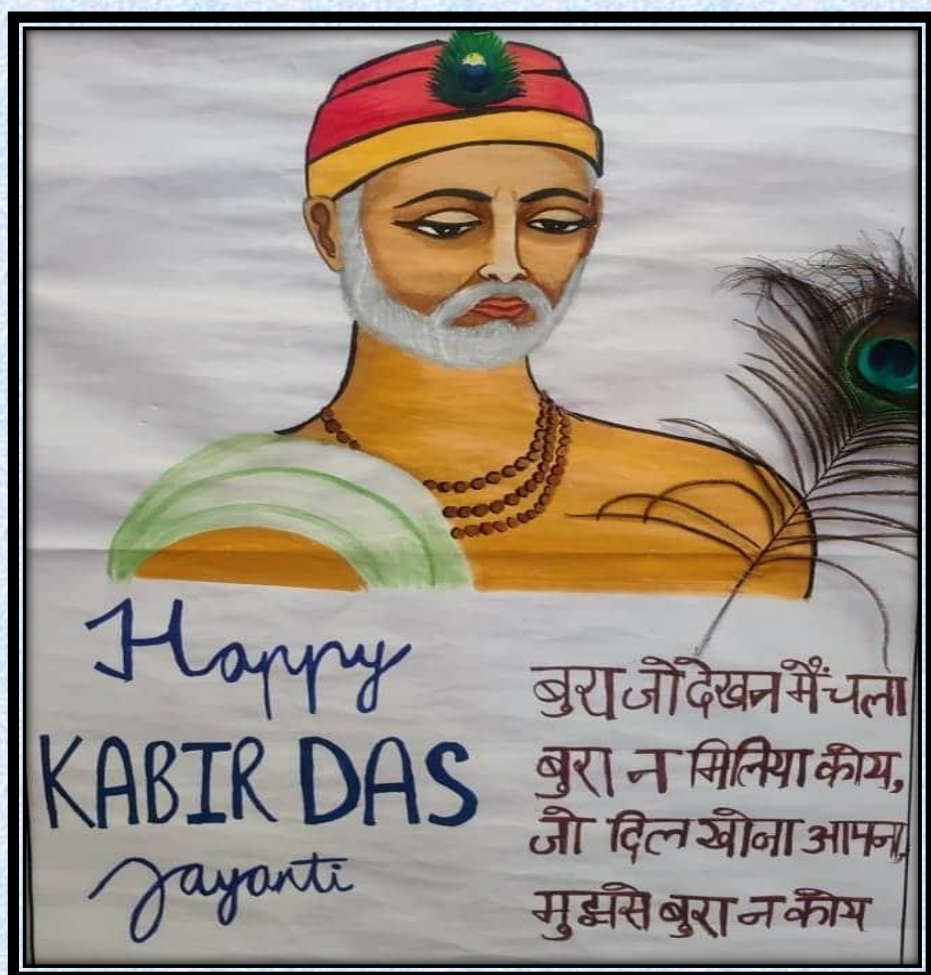
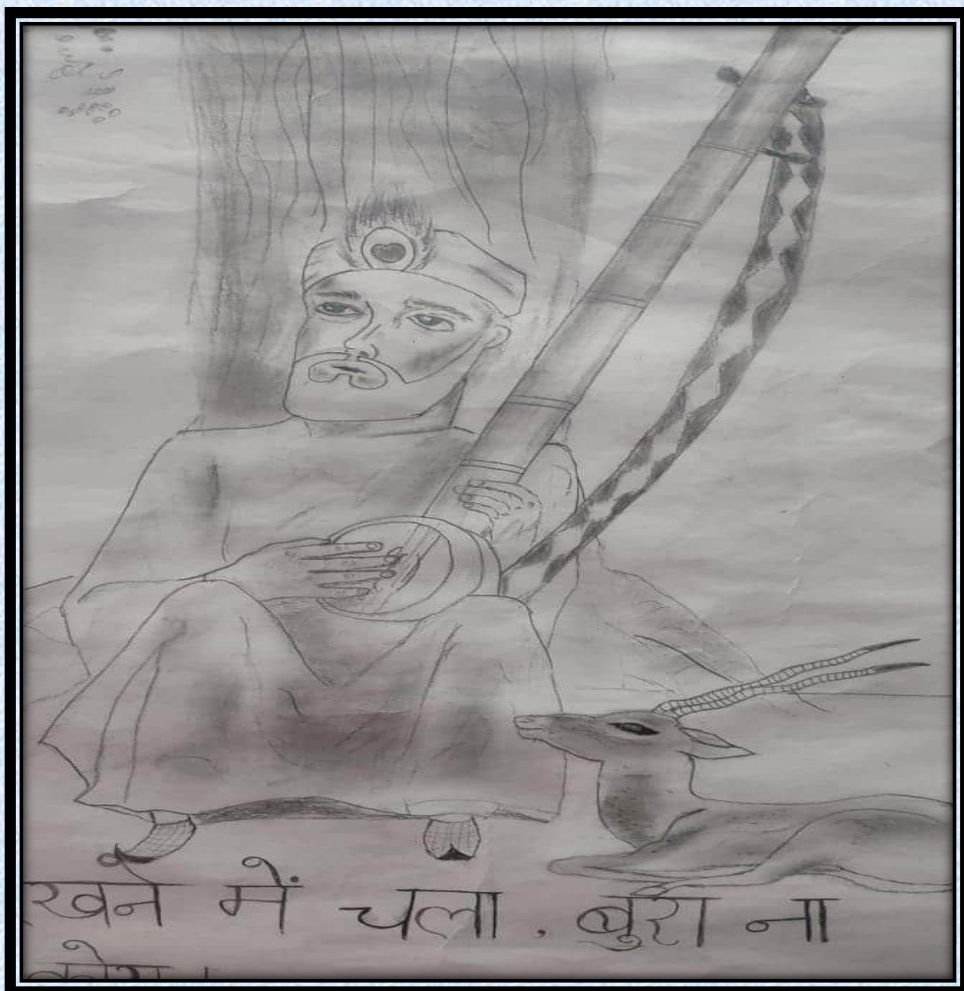

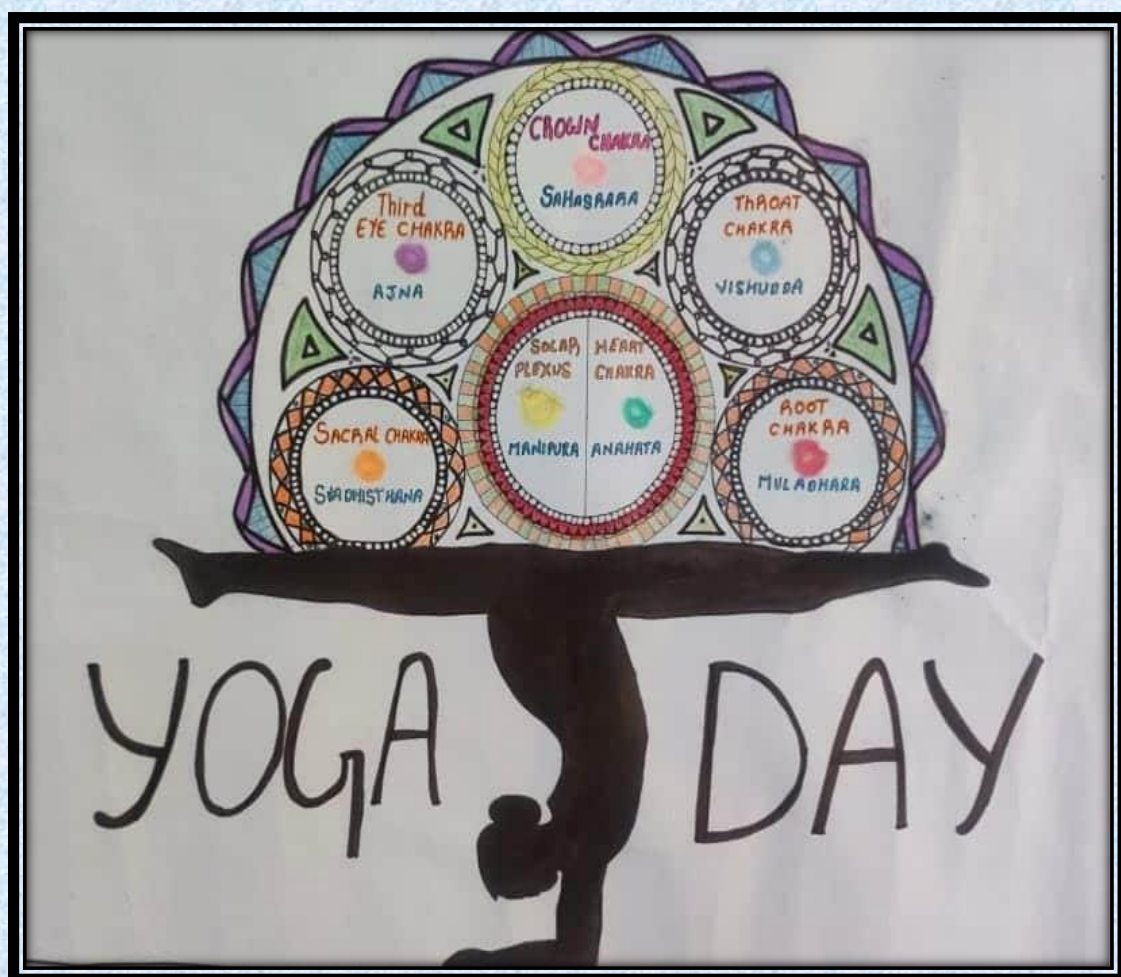
