

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CHILDREN'S DAY CELEBRATION






TRIP TO SARAHAN

OPEN HOUSE MEET









TWO-DAYS NCC TRAINING PROGRAMME

The school recently hosted a two-days NCC training programme for its cadets, on 17 Nov and 19 Nov conducted by experienced NCC instructors Sub Gurjeet, Hav Deepak and Hav Sunil from the 8 HP battalion Rampur. On the first day, the cadets were introduced to basic drill movements, uniform etiquette followed by a vigorous physical-fitness circuit that emphasized discipline and teamwork.
