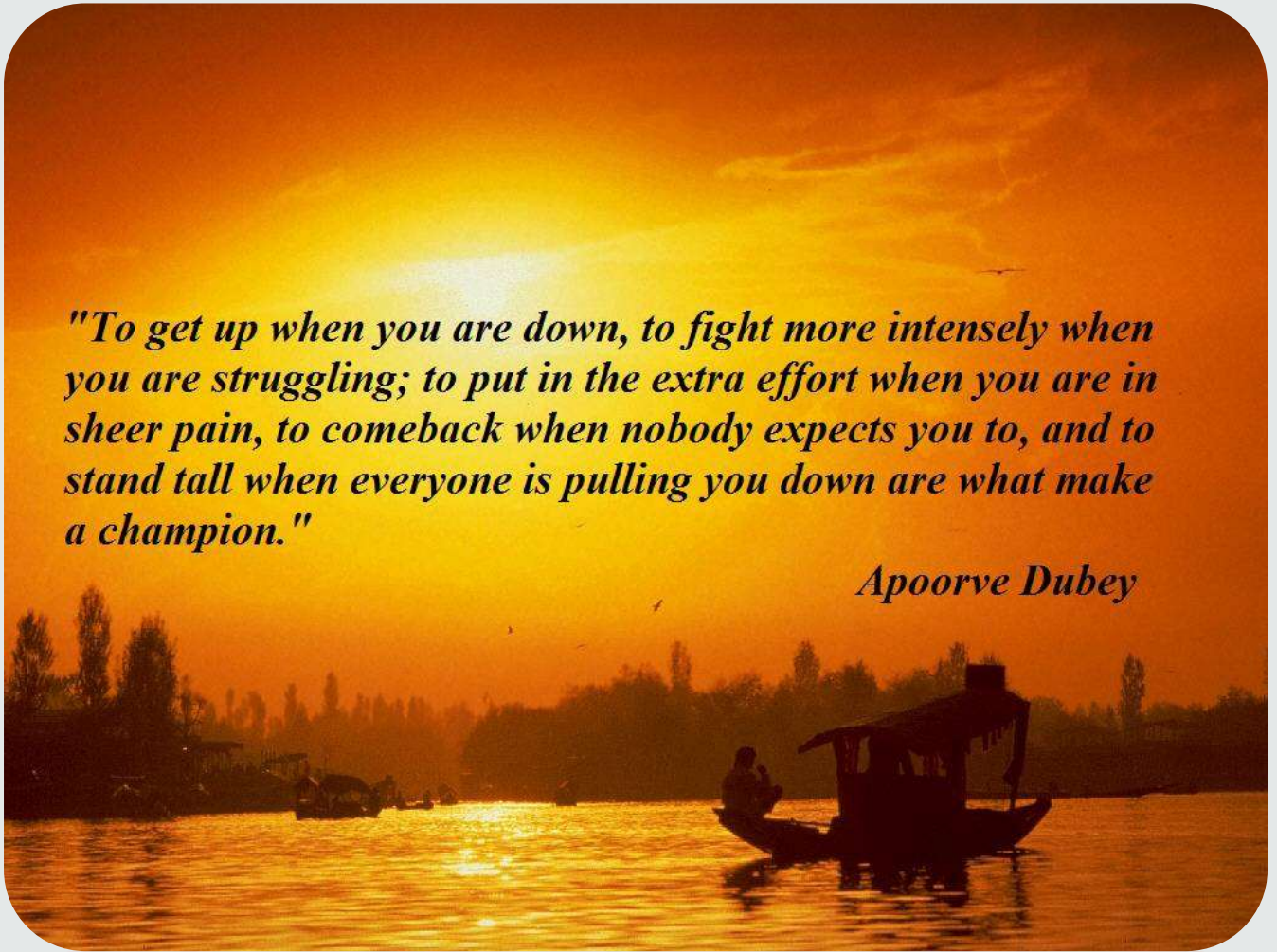

## Do's And Don'ts In Monsoon Season



### What Should We Do During Monsoon Season?

- Drink pure water. Ensure that you boil drinking water before consuming. Boiling kills germs and bacteria.
- Bath and take a shower every day. Personal hygiene is extremely important to maintain during this season of humidity. You sweat a lot during this season and bathing is a good way to avoid allergies and infections.
- Scrub your fruits and vegetable. This is another important point as the products you purchase may have come in contact with rainwater or other surfaces that might be damp or dirty. Cleaning your fruits and vegetable before use is important in every season but even more during the rainy season because of our immunity being weaker.
- Protect yourself from allergies by avoiding consuming the products that you are allergic to or suspect of being allergic to.
- Carry an umbrella to avoid getting drenched in the rain.





## What Are The Don'ts In Monsoon Season?

- Do not eat food from the street vendors.
- Do not let water stagnate in places and around your house. This becomes the breeding ground for mosquitoes.
- Avoid walking in dirty and muddy water.
- Do not sit in a room with the AC switched on if you are wet.
- Do not sit in wet clothes for a long time.

## Safety Tips For Monsoon Season

### ➤ Do not Touch Wires From Fallen Electricity Poles

Firstly children should be educated on the need to stay away from any electric wires from poles. Certainly they should stay away from water that accumulates around areas with electric poles. Besides fallen electric wires should be treated as live at all times.

### ➤ Stay Away From Lightning Prone Areas

No place is absolutely safe from lightning during a storm. Stay indoors during a storm that has lightning and thunders. Remember even a seemingly safe storm can bring unexpected bolts of lightning and loud roars of thunder. If you are caught in the middle of a storm never seek shelter under an isolated trees or where you are the tallest object as this is a prime target for lightning bolts. If you are in an open space stay low crouch down and keep your feet together.

### ➤ Precautions Against Mosquito's

Mosquito's breed more during the rainy season because they favour stagnant pools to lay their eggs and for the development of their larvae. Mosquito's transmit malaria and this disease can be fatal to adults and children if not urgently attended to.

### ➤ Avoid Walking or Working In Rain

It is very tempting to drive through or walk through a pool of water. Walking or working in pools of water or when it is raining puts you to the risk of a host of viral diseases. Above all Most of them can cause a wide range of fungal infections. For that reason people should avoid wet grounds. If you have to pass through



pools of water for some circumstances beyond your control, make sure to bath with soap and dry yourself to kill all sorts of germs that can cause illness.

## ➤ **Use Of Electrical Gadgets During A Storm**

Do not touch any electric wiring during a storm as this can potentially carry electricity from a bolt of lightning. For safety make sure you remove electrical gadgets before you hear the first rain drop otherwise after that it is too late and you could be exposing yourself to lightening.

Avoid playing video games connected to the television during a storm. If you suspect that your home may be flooded during a storm pull down the main power switch.

## ➤ **Attention To Weather Forecasts**

Please follow weather forecasts during the rainy seasons as they inform your day to day decisions. These decisions may bring safety to you and your family. The decision may range from switching of all electricity appliances before going to work, carrying an umbrella, collecting the kids from school before a heavy storm and telling your kid to stay at school if the local river is flooded.

### THEME -UDAAN-THROUGH SKILLS TO PERFECTION

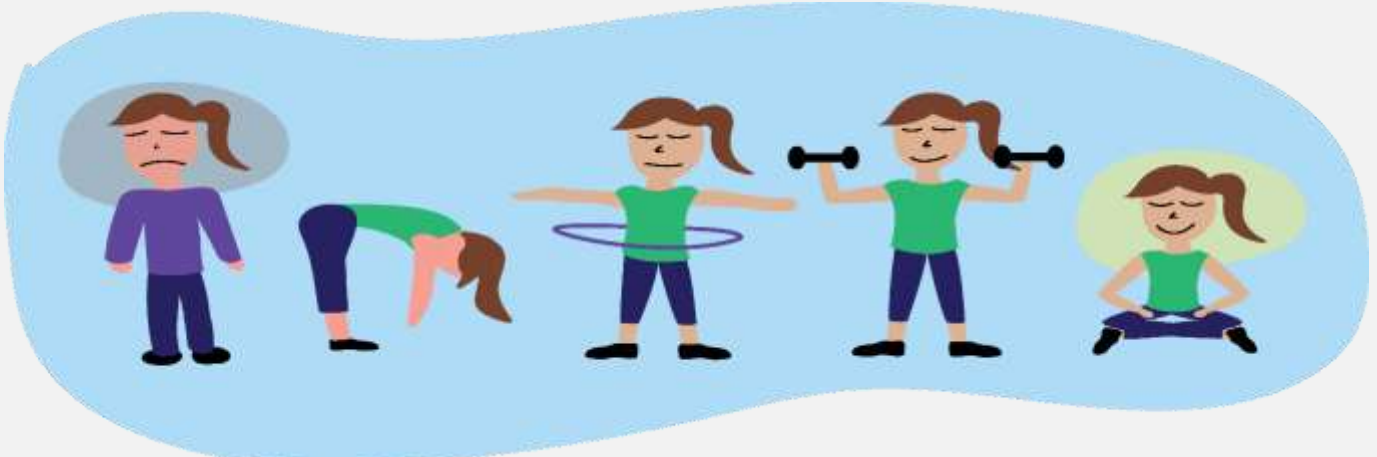


## Best Teaching Practices

**Exercise is the key not only for physical health but also for a peace of mind**

Children of all ages can benefit from being physically active. Physical activity is essential for good physical and mental health and wellbeing. Physical activity does not need to be a structured sport. Anything that gets them up and moving will benefit your child.

Tiny Tots had performed a few exercises on 14<sup>th</sup> July, 2023. Students performed a few simple physical exercises, which helped them to improve their attention, memory and to reduce the risk of depression. It helped them to build strong muscles and endurance. It also helped them to improve blood pressure and aerobic fitness.





## Best Teaching Practices

### Tiny Tots Activity – Reading Long Vowels & Sorting Pictures

Jindal Vidya Mandir, Vasind Pre Primary Kids (UKG) enjoyed the Activity of Reading of long vowel words and sorting the pictures related to long vowels by using long vowels sorting mats (A form of Teaching Learning Materials) on 18th July, 2023.

The objective of the activity was to make the reading and learning enjoyable. The students could recognize the pictures and read the words easily and clearly. The lesson was meaningful and enjoyable due to the Long Vowels sorting mats.







## Best Teaching Practices

Activity of recognizing and relating pictures with a letter was conducted for the students of UKG. It was of Hindi Vyanjan. This activity included visual perception, memory and auditory perception. A few students will be holding letters and others will one by one pick up picture flashcards.

They will recognize, identify and relate it with its letter.

This will help them to distinguish the shapes of letters from each other and make them able to point and state the letter names, as well as the sounds made by each letter and picture related to it.





## Best Teaching Practices

### Tiny Tots Vowels and Consonants activity

Kids may learn about consonants and vowels with these hands - on exercise. The vowels "a", "e", "i", "o" and "u" (and occasionally y) represent one type of letter, while the consonants are other letters in the alphabets. Teachers and students can delve a little further.



A vowel is a sound that is produced by opening the mouth and letting air flow out without closing the mouth or throat. By preventing the air coming from the mouth (either with the teeth, tongue or roof of the mouth) you can produce a consonant sound.

1. The teacher made flashcards for each letter and used labelled baskets, one for "consonants" and the other for "vowels."

2. The teacher distributed one flashcard to each student. The teacher also encouraged the students to say the sound aloud and identify whether it is said with the tongue, lips or roof of the mouth.

3. Students were able to identify and place flashcards in the appropriate basket.

The vowels and consonants were understood and learnt by the students.







## Best Teaching Practices

Basic numeracy skills like counting lay the foundation for more complex numeracy and Maths skills. Numeracy activity was conducted for UKG Class. Popsicle sticks counting and placing in the appropriate number pot in the number garden was the main activity. The activity of learning by doing was loved by the students.



Children enjoyed counting and it is essential that the children get acquainted with numbers because the numbers are the foundation for many other Mathematics skills. Children frequently count in order before understanding what the numbers signify.



## Best Teaching Practices

### Tiny Tots Nursery - Colour game activity

JVM Vasind conducted colour game activity for the students of Nursery. Learning of colours is a milestone in early childhood. Teaching colours to the students develops their visual perception and the students will be able to identify the basic colours by hands on experience.

With the growth and availability of cheap internet, the world has become a huge land of opportunities and threats. Today personal information such as financial data, health care data and personal information are stored online. They are under threat of being stolen if not kept secure. Countries across the globe are facing this new age threat in the internet space and have been taking up measures to secure their digital data. Developed nations around the world have understood the importance of cyber security and have been investing resources to educate students from primary classes in this field.

The Internet has no boundaries. It is borderless therefore crimes on Cyberspace has no restricted geographical jurisdiction. The crime would have triggered in Country X and the victim in Country Y. Hence cyber security is a vital part of the digital world.

### **Hacking:**

It is a process where someone who explores methods for breaching defenses and exploiting weaknesses in a computer system or network. (Source: Wikipedia)

The three types of hackers are:

- 1) White hat - hacks for ethical purpose e.g. Penetration testing for security of organization's information systems.
- 2) Grey hat - violates ethical standards, but does not have the malicious intent
- 3) Black hat - criminals who break into computer networks with malicious intent





A security breach/ Cyber-attack is targeted on individuals or organizations for the economic benefit of hacker or tarnishing the reputation of an individual or organization.

### **What is the SOS procedure for a victim?**

- 1) Inform the local police, preferably the Cyber Cell and file an FIR. Cyber Forensic experts will deploy strategies to investigate into the “When and How” and conduct an audit of all related devices. If money syphoning has happened, the bank to be informed immediately so that the victim can be advised the next course of action.
- 2) If credentials have been compromised, change password immediately.
- 3) Do not delete any evidence or history.

### **IMPORTANT:**

- ☐ Do not share login credentials with anybody.
- ☐ Invest in antivirus software and update it periodically.

### **Phishing:**

It is the fraudulent attempt to obtain sensitive information, or data, such as usernames, passwords and credit card details by disguising oneself as a trustworthy entity in an electronic communication. (Source: Wikipedia)

It resembles in concept to an angler throwing a baited hook out to catch fishes. Here the angler is the Cybercrime attacker and the fish is the victim.

Strategies used by cyber criminals:

- 1) Disguised email to trick the email recipient. E.g. Disguised email from the bank to click a link mapped to a malicious website or download an attachment which will be malware.
- 2) Clone a legitimate website and steal credential script or sensitive information.

### **Suggested proactive measures:**

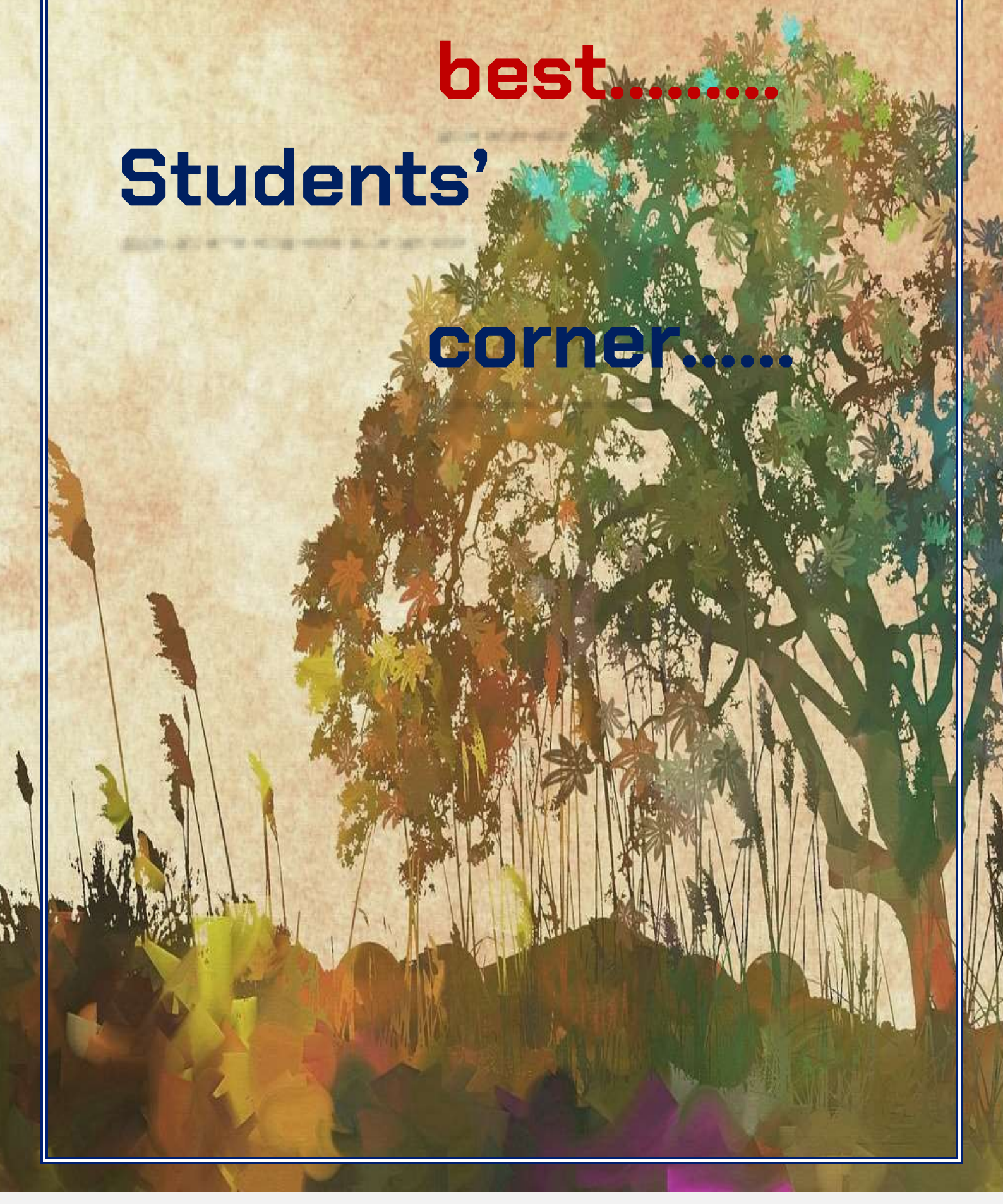

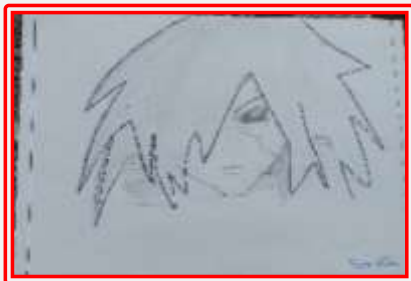

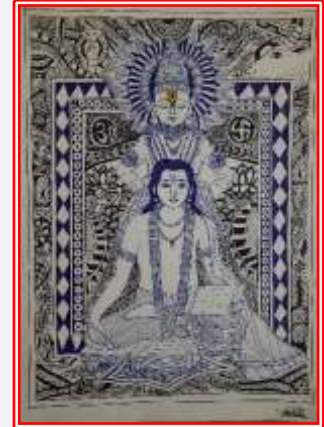
