



#### VASIND (2023 – 2024) HOME WORK POLICY AND GUIDELINES

In general, homework is an out-of-class activity/assignment allotted to the students as an extension or revision of classwork.

Here are the top 14 reasons why Homework is important:

- 1. It improves your child's thinking and memory
- 2. It helps your child develop positive study skills and habits that will serve him or her well throughout life
- 3. Homework encourages your child to use time wisely
- 4. It teaches your child to work independently
- Homework teaches your child to take responsibility for his or her work
- 6. It allows your child to review and practice what has been covered in class
- 7. It helps your child to get ready for the next day's class
- 8. Homework helps your child learn to use resources, such as libraries, reference materials, and computer Web sites to find information
- 9. It encourages your child to explores subjects more fully than classroom time permits
- It allows your child to extend learning by applying skills to new situations
- 11. It helps your child integrate learning by applying many different skills to a single task, such as book reports or science projects
- 12. Homework helps parents learn more about what your child is learning in school
- 13. It allows parents to communicate about what he or she is learning
- 14. It encourages parents to spark your child's enthusiasm.

#### Skill development:

- 1. Improves memory: While doing homework, students are able to revise all the topics that they learnt in the classroom. This helps in increasing their memory and in honing their learning skill.
  - Students learn to make good use of time: Students spend most of their time in completing their homework. This keeps them away from useless activities like spending long hours on television, phone or video games.
  - Students become independent: When students do their homework without the help of a teacher or friend, this makes them self-reliant and confident.
- 2. Students learn responsibility: When students do their homework daily, they understand that completing their homework is their responsibility. This makes them more responsible as a person.

- 3. Students get ready for next day class: Homework allows students to do some self-study, clear their doubts and this makes them ready for the next class.
- 4. Students learn to use resources: Students learn to use resources like libraries, the internet, etc., to find the information in order to complete their homework.
- 4. Allow students to explore subjects: Classrooms are all about listening to the teachers. However, homework allows students to understand the subjects better and explore their interests.
- 5. Allow parents to involve in studies of their child: Homework allows parents to know what their child is learning and get involve with the child in his/her studies.
- 6. Improves academic performance: Learning in classrooms is not sufficient to score good grades in academics. Self-study is equally important for scoring high grades.

  Homework allows students to revise classroom learnings and builds the habit of self-study. This helps them to score better& understand the concept/topic for life time.
- 7. Increases concentration: While doing homework, students find an isolated place to study where they can concentrate more.
- 8. Develops essential life skills: While working on assignments, students find a solution to every problem and they even manage to complete the assignment on time. This develops time management skill and problem-solving skill in them.

So, these were some points that clearly show that homework is essential so we understand the significance of homework for students. That is why our mentors give homework to each student. Self-study is also a vital part of students' schedule at JVM VASIND so that they can build their concepts and score well along with gaining skills such as problem-solving, time-management, confidence and a sense of responsibility and develop them holistically.

#### **Evaluation of Home work:**

Subject wise group wise monitors were made by respective teachers. Every day the monitor check the home work as per schedule and prepare the chart. The chart will be put -up in the class display board with the permission of the subject teacher.

#### **GENERAL RULES OF DISCIPLINE**

- 1. All students should be present in school on the opening day of each term.
- 2. Irregular attendance, unjustified absence or objectionable moral behaviour, absence from school examination, non-payment of fees justifies dismissal. If a student is absent for more than ten consecutive days without an application or for three days at the beginning of a term his / her name may be struck off the rolls.
- 3. No student who has been absent from school or is late will be admitted into class without the granted permission of the principal.
- 4. Students, unless required to stay back for any purpose with permission of the principal, should leave the premises as soon as the school gets over. The school authorities are not responsible for any pupil after the school hours. Necessary arrangements should therefore be made to take or collect children home immediately after the school.
- 5. No books other than required text books or periodicals, approved by the principal, may be brought into the school premises.
- 6. No child should leave the premises during school hours without the knowledge and permission of the principal.
- 7. Any damage to school property will have to be made good. The decision of the principal regarding the amount of penalty will be final.
- 8. The school is not responsible for goods lost. Children should not bring or wear valuable articles when in school.
- 9. Students are not allowed to receive visitors or make phone calls. They will not be permitted to leave the class to answer the phone calls. If the matter is very urgent, message will be conveyed.
- 10. A student desiring to be exempted from P.E. or Games Class must produce a medical certificate to the effect that he/she is physically unfit to take part.
- 11. Students are urged to contribute to high tone of the school by their manners and general behaviour.
- 12. They should be polite, friendly and well behaved in and outside the school. They should be respectful to their elders and teachers and be truthful all the time.
- 13. They should be orderly in their appearance and neatly dressed.

- 14. In the classroom a student is expected to maintain proper posture, cleanliness, silence and attention to work. Besides, showing respect to teachers and companions is compulsory.
- 15. They should maintain absolute silence during the General Assembly and while moving into the classroom from the General Assembly. Silence should also be observed on the way or while returning from games, library, lab, art, etc.
- 16. General Assembly is the most important part of the school day. Every student must be present in it. Begin the day with prayer to God and listen to the announcements.
- 17. Text and exercise books along with necessary material have to be brought to school according to the day's routine / Time table.
- 18. Students are not allowed to visit the staff room without due permission.
- 19. No collective petition or complain will be entertained. However reasonable and individual ones may be empathetically attended to.
- 20. Penalties may be imposed by the principal at his / her discretion for breach of discipline or for habitual irregularity or late attendance.
- 21. Private tutors may not be engaged except after consulting the Principal and with his / her written consent. No tuition may be taken from the teacher who teaches the student.
- 22. All pupils when admitted and while studying in this school must make themselves acquainted with the rules notified for their conduct. Ignorance of the rules is not an excuse.
- 23. The Principal's permission is required:
  - a) to make a collection for any purpose whatsoever.
  - b) to arrange for a party, get together, picnic or meeting.
  - c) to join a Sports Meet or to play in a game not arranged by the school.
  - d) to give presents to teachers or hold function in their honour.
  - e) to arrange for private tuitions from the school teachers.



#### SCHOOL RULES

- 1. Students should reach school by 8.25 A.M. to enable school work to commence at 8.30 A.M. Students, who arrive late, will be sent back home.
- 2. They should carry the diary to school with the personal record completed and signed by parents.
- 3. Parents are responsible for the child's safe travel and the pick-up and drop of the child in the school.
- 4. Those who come to school in their own transport, they should arrive at the school minutes before the school bell time.
- 5. They should be neatly dressed. The school uniform is to be worn everyday and for all the school activities.
- 6. They must come to the class with lessons well prepared and the home work completed.
- 7. Running, playing and shouting inside the school building and corridors are not allowed.
- 8. They will not be allowed to go home during school hours. Parents are requested not to make any social engagement or medical appointment during school hours. Parents should not send their children to school on the day they have such an appointment during school hours.
- 9. Order must be the hallmark of the school. The school expects every child to contribute to the standard of excellence.
- 10. Change of classrooms between the periods should be done in silence and orderly fashion.
- 11. Students are advised to keep their classroom, building and campus as neat as possible and throw waste into a dustbin only.
- 12. Students are expected to respect the property of others, which includes respect for school property.
- 13. No student should damage things belonging to others. Damage done even by accident should be reported to the concerned authority. Any damage done should be made good by the one who causes it. Anyone who notices any damage should report the matter even if he or she is unaware who has done it and would be considered for the Best Student Award.
- 14. Articles found in the school premises are to be handed over to the school office.
- 15. Lending or borrowing of money and other articles are not permitted.
- 16. No child will remain in the class during P.E. or Games period unless permitted by the principal or by a written permission.
- 17. As far as possible, a student once reported to school, should not be asked to go home or leave the school, except in an emergency case.

- 18. Jindal Vidya Mandir students should display polite behaviour wherever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged by their conduct. They should greet teachers & elders when they meet them. Bullying and use of foul language are punishable offences.
- 19. The school reserves the right to suspend or to take strict disciplinary action against students whose progress is constantly unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students.
- 20. A student who uses unfair means during a test or exam, will be given "Zero" marks in the subject and Report Card. Repetition of the same will result dismissal from the school.
- 21. Student should realize that they are responsible to the school authorities not only for their conduct in school but also for their general behaviour outside. Any reported or observed objectionable conduct on their part shall make them liable to disciplinary action.
- 22. During the absence of the teachers, pupils shall not leave the classroom or their place or make a noise. They will listen to the monitor's instructions and maintain silence and order in the class.
- 23. Students should avoid writing, carving, scratching on the walls and furniture. Such habits are detrimental to good education and are signs of low taste.
- 24. No student shall indulge in unruly, violent or harmful behaviour.
- 25. The observance of the rules of discipline of school and good behaviour is an essential condition to a student's continuance in school. In case a student violates the school rules and indulges in any form of indiscipline, strict action like expulsion, suspension, rustication shall be taken.
- 26. Any student who is persistently insubordinate or is repeatedly or willfully mischievous or is guilty of gross malpractice in connection with examination or of unauthorized alteration or manipulation in authorized documents or certificates or Progress Report, may be removed from the rolls at the discretion of the principal. The removal may be temporary or permanent according to the gravity of the offence.
- 27. No books (other than text books or library books or required periodicals), magazine or money should be brought to the school without the principal's permission.
- 28. Students are not allowed to enter the classroom other than their own.
- 29. Being a co-ed school, it is expected that students behave in a manner which brings a good name to the school community and do not indulge in any anti-social activity in or outside the school.
- 30. It is expected that the juniors be treated with love and affection, while the juniors show all respect to their seniors.



#### **DUTIES OF A CLASS MONITOR**

- 1. The Class Monitor must be exemplary in conduct and industrious in his/her studies.
- 2. He/ She must be able to command respect in class.
- 3. He/ She is employed for all assistance in the class, e.g. maintaining discipline, collecting or distributing books, attending to cleanliness and neatness of the classroom, bringing charts, maps reporting to the concerned authorities about various needs of the class, update of class notice board, etc.
- 4. The class monitor will write each day on the board the date and the number of students present out of the total in the class.
- 5. As soon as the teacher leaves the class, the class monitor is supposed to take charge.
- 6. He/ She is supposed to maintain silence and discipline, while performing their duties.
- 7. Loitering around for any reason, in any case should not be allowed.
- 8. Mischievous student's name / students' names are to be given to the concerned subject or class teacher.
- 9. He/ She shall be responsible for all happenings in the class during the absence of the teacher.
- 10. To be a class monitor is a special privilege and honour. To betray the trust in him/her is to commit the most degrading act.
- 11. It is imperative that all class monitors report to the teacher in-charge or the class teacher, any breach of discipline noticed even during the recess.
- 12. In the event of a teacher being absent, they must inform the Section Co-ordinator within the first five minutes from the commencement of the period, which can be further reported to the Principal / Supervisor.
- 13. He/ She must ensure that all the students speak in English.
- 14. He/ She must ensure that the students do not touch the Smart board and Green board.
- 15. He/ She should monitor all the happenings of the class strictly and report to the teacher in case of any mishap.
- 16. In case any student is not feeling well, the monitor should inform a teacher or a co-ordinator available.
- 17. The monitor, with the help of two other students, should carry out a surprise check of school bags and diaries.
- 18. The monitor, with the help of two other students, must check the uniform of all the other students regularly.
- 19. The monitor should highlight the names of the well-disciplined students.
- 20. The monitor should switch off the lights, fans and Smart board before leaving the classroom.
- 21. The monitor, along with others, must ensure the cleanliness of the classroom.

#### **GENERAL GUIDELINES TO PARENTS**

None of the school objectives can fully be realised without the full co- operation and active support from parents. Some of the points requiring parent's co-operation are listed below:

- 1. Please read and understand the contents of the Student Diary. In case of any doubts, you may personally clear these from the school.
- Ensure that the Student Diary is carried to the school by your ward/wards on all working days. Check it each day for entries from the school. In addition, make effective use of it for better communication with the school staff.
- 3. Ensure that your ward takes breakfast and leaves home in time to reach school punctually.
- 4. Ensure strict adherence to prescribed uniforms, cleanliness and personal hygiene of your ward/wards.
- 5. See that all required textbooks / notebooks and stationery are carried to school each day.
- 6. Constantly encourage students to take a continuous and balanced interest not only in studies but also in all other activities of the school.
- 7. Check whether homework and other assignments are completed as required.
- 8. Parents should furnish the school with latest office and residence address and telephone numbers. These are vital in the interest and safety of the ward(s).
- 9. Students suffering from infectious or contagious diseases should be sent to school only after the mandatory period of quarantine is over.
- 10. Regularly check that all the circulars issued by the school have been received and acknowledged through the Diary.
- 11. Students should be advised to take good care of the school property or else they will have to pay a fine for the damages, the decision of which rests upon the school.
- 12. Pocket money to the wards should be restricted and should be sufficient to cover minor requirements. No money is to be given for any events organized by the school unless asked for through a circular.
- 13. Parents should do their utmost to ensure good level of communication with their wards.
- 14. A student who fails to pay fees up to date will not be allowed to appear for the examination.
- 15. Parents are requested to enforce regularity and discipline. They will see that their children prepare the lessons daily, prepare the work set to them and see that they devote sufficient time to their studies.
- 16. Politeness and courtesy in speech and conduct should be inculcated.

- 17. Any communication (request or complaint) made by the parents / guardian should be addressed to the principal and not to the class teacher. When thus communicating with the principal, parents / guardians are requested to mention in their letter, the name and class of their wards.
- 18. No visitors (parents or others) are allowed to see students or teachers during the school hours without due permission.
- 19. Parents are also requested not to visit classes during school hours. All business will be transacted in the office.
- 20. Parents are also requested not to send for or call away their wards during class hours without application except in case of an unforeseen emergency.
- 21. Parents / guardians are particularly expected to sign messages, Progress Reports or any similar documents when requested. Failure to do so may put their wards to great inconvenience and render them liable to being sent home. Repeated late coming, forgetting to bring books may be punishable in the same way.
- 22. Giving gifts to any of the school employees either in cash or in kind shall be totally discouraged.
- 23. Small children should not be entrusted with the payment of fees.
- 24. Under any circumstances, answer scripts of students for the terminal or final examination will not be returned to parents, private tutors or others.
- 25 The interpretation of any rule in this prospectus as well as any amendments rests solely and entirely with the Governing Body of the school. This shall be final and binding on the parents /guardians and in no case shall lie in any court of law in respect of the decision.
- 26. Parents must ensure that their ward is not involved in driving a vehicle which is not permissible by the law. Strict action shall be taken if under-aged students are found to be driving vehicles which are allowed for adults only.
- 27. Parent must also go through the proforma named as "Parent's Monthly Observation of Diary" at the month end to keep a track of every month's entries made therein by the student and teachers.



#### **LEAVE RULES**

- 1) Leave of absence is granted on a previous written application from the parents or guardians.
- 2) Students who have been ill should bring a medical certificate from their doctor on reporting back to school.
- 3) Parents should fill up "Record of Leave" for each day if the student is absent from school stating reason for absence.
- 4) A student who has been absent on the previous day will not be allowed in the class without a letter from the parent addressed to the class teacher stating the reason for absence.
- 5) Students suffering from diseases like Chicken pox, Cholera, Measles, Mumps, Whooping Cough & Jaundice must observe the period of quarantine as prescribed by a physician.
- 6) A student returning to school after suffering from infectious or contagious disease should produce a Doctor's Certificate or Approved Medical Certificate.
- 7) Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than ten consecutive days may render the student liable to have his/her name struck off the rolls. Re-admission may be granted only on payment of fresh admission fees or with due official permission.
- 8) No student may leave the school premises during the school working hours without the written permission of the principal.
- 9) 80% attendance is compulsory for every pupil to be eligible to appear for the final exams.

#### **LIBRARY RULES**

- 1) Students should make it a matter of personal pride to utilise the library books with utmost care.
- 2) No book should be taken from the library without proper entry in the issue register.
- 3) Only one book shall be issued at a time.
- 4) The attention of the librarian should be drawn to any damages of the books.
- 5) A book may not be kept beyond two days. It may be re-issued. For a renewal, the book must be produced to the library.
- 6) All the books must be returned before the end of each term. The borrower who fails to return a book, will have to pay fine of Rs. 5.00/- per day.
- 7) Library cards and books are not transferable.
- 8) Students are responsible for the books issued. Any damage caused to the books shall be liable to penalty.
- 9) Only required notebook, pencil or pens may be brought inside the library along with library books due for return.






