Introduction

A two-day teacher training programme was organized at JVM School, Vasind by The Teacher Foundation (TTF). The training was designed to enhance teaching practices by focusing on the relational and learning aspects of education. The sessions aimed to sensitize teachers to the importance of building strong teacher-student relationships and to develop a deeper understanding of how students learn.

Module 1: Orientation and Teaching as Relationship

Date: 25th August 2025

Objectives

- To familiarize teachers with the goals and expectations of the training.
- To highlight the role of relationships in effective teaching and learning.
- To develop reflective practices that promote trust, empathy, and respect in classrooms.

Key Discussions and Activities

- · Ice-breaking session to build rapport among teachers.
- · Group discussions on the qualities of impactful teachers.
- · Reflection exercises on personal teaching experiences.
- · Role-play activities to demonstrate effective teacher-student interactions.

Outcomes

- · Teachers understood that teaching is not only about curriculum delivery but also about nurturing positive relationships.
- They recognized the role of empathy, communication, and respect in building a supportive classroom culture.
- · Increased awareness of the teacher's role as a facilitator and mentor.

Module 2: Understanding Learning

Date: 26th August 2025

Objectives

- · To explore how students learn and construct knowledge.
- To understand the influence of learning theories on classroom practices.
- To recognize learner diversity and adapt teaching strategies accordingly.

Key Discussions and Activities

- Interactive presentation on theory of *Multiple Intelligence* (Howard Gardner's theory)
- · Case study discussions on learning challenges faced by students.
- Group activities where teachers designed differentiated instructional strategies.
- · Sharing of best practices from different teaching levels (Pre-Primary, Primary, Secondary).

Outcomes

- · Teachers developed an understanding of learning as an active, continuous, and social process.
- They gained insights into learner differences and the need for differentiated instruction.
- · Teachers committed to adopting more learner-centered approaches, fostering critical thinking and creativity.

Overall Reflections

The two-day training programme was highly interactive and engaging. Teachers actively participated in discussions, role plays, and collaborative tasks. The sessions reinforced the importance of teaching as a relationship and provided practical strategies for understanding learning more deeply. Both facilitators, Ms. Nidhi Soni and Dr. Reeshma Suri, created an encouraging environment that enabled teachers to share, reflect, and grow professionally. The training helped the 57 participating teachers to strengthen their teaching practices and align them with holistic, student-centered learning.

Conclusion

The training programme successfully met its objectives of enhancing teachers' relational and pedagogical skills. Teachers left the sessions with renewed motivation to build meaningful relationships with their students and to implement learner-friendly approaches in their classrooms. The objective of the training was to enable teachers to use questioning as an effective pedagogical tool to enhance classroom interaction, stimulate curiosity, and promote higher-order thinking among students.

The resource person highlighted various types of questioning techniques such as probing, reflective, divergent, and higher-order questions. Teachers were guided on how to frame purposeful questions, allow adequate wait-time, and encourage students to respond meaningfully.





To demonstrate the practical application of strategies, demo sessions were conducted for Grade 8

Science and Grade 7 Social Science classes. These sessions illustrated how effective questioning can transform passive learning into active participation. Teachers actively observed, reflected, and shared their insights during group discussions.



The participants found the workshop highly engaging and relevant. They appreciated the practical tips, templates, and real-classroom examples that could be easily adapted to their subjects. The training concluded with an action plan where teachers resolved to consciously integrate well-planned questioning into their daily lessons.

In conclusion, the "Power of Questioning" session successfully equipped teachers with strategies to strengthen classroom dialogue, making learning more interactive, reflective, and student-centered.
